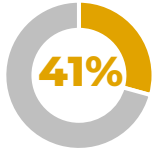

## The Summary

Overall, positive YTD trend has been depicted for the Q2 this year– comparing with last year’s applications received with significant increment. At YTD applications by course level as of June, accumulated highest applications received were from the applicants to pursue Masters (30%), followed by Degree (28%), PhD (27%), Certificate (10%) and Diploma (5%) applicants respectively.

On the whole, Private Higher Institution has the highest number of applications received with 63% from the total applications, followed by 33% applicants were applying to pursue at Public Institution. Meanwhile for Top 5 countries of inbound students were notably from China, with about 45% applications received from the grand total, as of June, giving an increment of about 43% from the previous quarter.

Meanwhile for top course applied by the applicants as of June was for Social Sciences, Business and Law, followed by Science, Mathematics and Computing and Education respectively.

## From the CEO’s Office

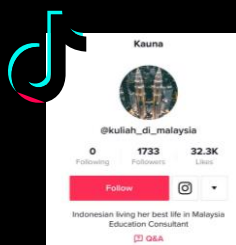
